Curriculum Guide and Proficiency Statements

By the end of German 1 students are able to:

1. Understand language that contains well-rehearsed sentence patterns and familiar vocabulary.
2. Demonstrate basic pronunciation and know the letters of the alphabet.
3. Interact in predictable exchanges.
4. Understand and demonstrate the situations and differences when using the polite and informal German language.
5. Read and write straightforward versions of what they have learned to say.
6. Be aware of and understand some of the typical cultural conventions that operate in interpersonal communication.
7. Be competent with basic vocabulary for nouns, verbs, adjectives, pronouns, prepositions, and basic phraseology.
8. Demonstrate their command of basic grammar including all four cases of nominative, accusative, dative, and genitive.
9. Develop an awareness of the language-learning process.
10. Understand basic Germanic culture and how it is different than the United States.
11. Comprehend and identify an outline level view of German history.

By the end of German 1 students should have the following German language communication skills:

1. Greet, say farewell, and thank people.
2. Respond to greetings and thanks.
3. Introduce themselves and others and respond to introductions.
4. Demonstrate conventions involved in greeting people (e.g., names, titles, shaking hands, nodding heads, etc.).
5. Write and speak using days of the week, months, and dates in their correct German formats.
6. Communicate about personal information, such as name, age, nationality, and where they live.
7. Communicate about location.
8. Understand and use a range of politeness conventions (for example, ways of

- thanking people, apologizing, excusing themselves, complimenting people).
9. Use and respond to simple classroom language (including asking for the word to express something in German).
 10. Communicate about relationships between people.
 11. Communicate about ownership and belongings (such as pets or the contents of a school bag).
 12. Communicate about likes and dislikes, giving reasons where appropriate.
 13. Communicate about time, weather, and seasons.
 14. Communicate about events and where they take place.
 15. Give and follow directions.
 16. Communicate, including comparing and contrasting, about how people travel.
 17. Communicate about physical characteristics, personality, and feelings.
 18. Identify and ask questions about basic colors.
 19. Identify and ask questions about parts of the body and their unique German grammar elements.
 20. Describe how Christmas, birthdays, and special occasions are celebrated.
 21. Describe and use vocabulary for family life and family relations in German-Speaking countries.
 22. Describe different foods, mealtime vocabulary, and common verbal exchanges in restaurants.
 23. Understand the German school system and das Abitur.
 24. Describe important sports and leisure activities in Germany.
 25. Use vocabulary for and understand how to use transportation systems.
 26. Describe accommodations, rooms, and furniture.
 27. Describe shops and shopping.

Specific Listening, speaking, reading, writing skills:

1. Identify the sounds of letters of the alphabet, letter combinations, intonation, and stress patterns;
2. Recognize and understand simple, familiar words and phrases.
3. Imitate the pronunciation, intonation, stress, and rhythm of words, phrases, and sentences.
4. Respond appropriately to simple, familiar instructions and simple questions.
5. Ask simple questions in German using *W-Fragen* and placing the verb at the beginning of the sentence.
6. Write simple, familiar words, phrases, and sentences using the conventions of

written language, such as the umlaut and punctuation.

2. Adverbs and adverbial expressions including location and intensity
3. Definite and Indefinite Articles

9. The model verbs and their use including conjunctives

 - d. Separable prefixes (with *kommen, stehen, and other*) reflexives
 - e. Verbs affecting case
